Bloodborne Pathogens Training (29 CFR 1910.1030)

Introduction

In compliance with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulation, this annual refresher training is for individuals dealing with Bloodborne Pathogens. The OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens regulation applies to employees such as housekeepers, laboratory technicians, nurses, physicians, morticians, custodians, laundry personnel and other employees who may come in contact with blood or potentially infectious materials.

There are various bloodborne pathogens but Hepatitis B (HBV) and the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) are the two diseases addressed by the OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens Regulation. Therefore, this course will focus on these two bloodborne pathogens. Concerns about work place safety and for employees led OSHA to issue a new standard - Bloodborne Pathogens (29 CFR 1910.1030) – to educate employees about bloodborne diseases. This annual refresher-training course can be taken on-line while complying with the OSHA regulations. This course has been approved by the American Board of Industrial Hygiene-Approval Number 13335.

While this training course is very comprehensive, we highly recommend that additional site-specific training be taken for certain hazardous materials, that may be encountered at different sites. The purpose of this training is to identify the appropriate kinds of facilities, discuss work practices for reducing exposures, and the handling and management of bloodborne pathogens agents.
